

These maps are intended to show the location of services and do not represent the entire community.






Allenford is situated on the bank of the Sauble River and was originally known as Driftwood Crossing.

Chief Administrative Officer (CAO)

The Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) is the senior manager appointed by Council. They are responsible for the management of the administration of our local government. They provide strategic direction to the organization and ensure that its actions are in alignment with Council priorities and provisions of the Municipal Act and other legislation. The CAO is the head of staff for the municipality, and through the various departments is responsible for providing and maintaining essential services. The CAO also acts as a liaison between staff and Council, providing support in the areas of policy, planning, budgeting, and community development.

Clerk

The Office of the Clerk is an essential link between the residents of Arran-Elderslie and Council. The Clerk is responsible for several statutory duties under the Municipal Act and other legislation. The Clerk and the Mayor are the signing officers for the Municipality The Clerk oversees and manages a variety of administrative and legislative functions including:

- ·Cemetery administration
- ·Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act
- ·Providing Commissioner of Oath services
- ·Conducting Municipal Elections
- ·Deputy Registrar for Vital Statistics and Cemeteries
- ·Issuing Certificates and Licenses
- ·Maintaining corporate records and by-laws
- ·Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection to Privacy Act Requests

Finance Department

The Finance Department is responsible for the municipal financial records, accounts payable, receivables, payroll, purchasing, water billing, property tax billing, collections, managing customer inquiries and financial information for the Municipality.

Property Taxes

Revenue from property taxes is used to provide municipal services and programs to residents. Taxes provide the main source of revenue for the Municipality, County and School Boards.

Tax Bills are generated twice a year with four (4) installment dates; March, June, August & October.

Many forms of payment are accepted including mail, internet, telephone banking, pre-authorized payments or in-person at the Municipal Office. Online forms for signing up for pre-authorized payments and or e-billing are available on our website under the living here section.

Parking

Parking is available throughout the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie at a number of free and paid parking lots. Parking passes are available to purchase on our website or at the Municipal Office. View our Parking By-Law on our website under Living Here for full details.

Dog Tags

All dogs must be registered in the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie. You can view our Animal Control By-Law on our website under Living Here for full regulations and fines. Registration fee is due March 31. You must license your dog each year or obtain a permit for a kennel. A dog tag must be attached to the dog's collar at all times. New dogs may be registered at any time. It is your responsibility to notify the office if there is any change to your pet's information, you are moving out of the Municipality, or you no longer have a dog.



In the winter, please help by removing any snow banks around hydrants, and always avoid parking of vehicles around the hydrants, as valuable time can be lost if fire fighters must clear snow or work around cars upon their arrival at an emergency.

ARE YOU PREPARED?


Emergencies are always unexpected and often catch us unprepared. Health Canada recommends having a 72 hour Emergency Preparedness kit available in the event of a power failure, snow and ice storm, flooding etc.

HAVE ON HAND:

- At least three day's supply of food and water (4 litres per person/day)
- · Canned food, crackers and biscuits, honey, peanut butter, jam, instant coffee, tea etc.
- Cutlery, disposable plates, can opener, waterproof matches, and garbage bags.

Prepare an emergency survival kit containing: Flashlight, radio, spare batteries, first aid kit, candles and matches/lighter, clothing and footwear, blankets, sleeping bags, receptacle, medication, pet supplies, plastic bags and toilet tissue.

Public Works Department

The Municipality of Arran-Elderslie maintains approx. 362 km of roads and streets, and owns and maintains over 65 bridges.

The Public Works Department plans and directs the construction and maintenance of Municipal roads, bridges, parking lots, culverts, streetlights, sidewalks, civic address numbers, municipal drains and other infrastructure as well as manages garbage and recycling collection and landfill sites.

Garbage Collection

Garbage is collected weekly in Arran-Elderslie.

Garbage bags must be at the curbside by 7:00 a.m.

A maximum of two garbage bags per week are permitted from residential properties.

Bag tags may be purchased at the Municipal Office for \$3.50.

Corrugated Cardboard

Corrugated cardboard will not be picked up with your recycling.

Residential waste, demo materials, unpainted wood, brush, electronic waste, bale wrap, white packing styrofoam and tires are permitted at this location for a fee. Compost and cardboard are accepted free of charge. Compost material is must be bagged in a brown compostable paper bag or in bulk. All compost containers are to be emptied and removed from the compost site. Blue Board that is used for building purposes and Hazardous Waste are not accepted.

Chesley Landfill 230 4th Street SW

Open the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and every Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in October and November. Only unpainted wood, tires, brush and metal will be accepted at this location. There is no charge for wood and brush at this location. No residential garbage is permitted.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Chesley Landfill will be open EVERY Saturday in October & November for free leaf/compost drop-off.

The Arran Landfill is open weekly Thursdays 8am-3pm and Saturday 8am-12 noon for free leaf/compost drop-off. 2025 curbside leaf collection will occur on October 28th & November 18th.

Please call the Municipal Office 519-363-3039 x102 to be placed on the list.

Leaves must be in biodegradable paper bags and at the curb by 8am. Materials in plastic bags will not be collected.



Arran-Elderslie owns and maintains facilities and sports fields that you can enjoy including community centres, ball diamonds, pools, parks, splash pads, soccer fields and many multi-purpose spaces. Facilities are available for a variety of services, programs and recreational opportunities. The Municipality also offers a wide variety of programs for residents of all ages and abilities. Splash Pads

Three Community Splash Pads are now operational, thanks to the dedicated community volunteers and generous donations and provincial grants. Splash pads typically open in early June and close mid September, and can be enjoyed from 8am - 10pm

Community Centres

Arran-Elderslie is home to three community centres, located in Chesley, Paisley and Tara. These facilities offer a wide variety of programs, activities and rental space for any occasion.

Chesley Community Centre offers a single ice pad from September to March and an arena floor from April to August. Also located within the building is a boardroom, community hall (cap 325), kitchen and curling club.

Paisley Community Centre has a single ice pad from October to March and an arena floor from April to September. A community hall (cap 122), kitchen and curling club is also located within the facility.

Tara-Arran Community Centre offers a single ice pad from late October until March and an arena floor from April to October. The facility also offers a community hall (cap 210), kitchen and curling club.

Sports Fields


